Q6b - College researchers examined associate-and-higher program declarations and outcomes during the time period, which for this reporting were labeled by their department as the simplest connotation of program area. Researchers only examined programs in this way if they carried at least ten declared students in at least one of the reporting years. The researchers counted students who both carried an active declaration in the given program during the given year and who were enrolled in at least one degree-credit course (in any program) during that year. Enrolled students carrying declarations in BUILDING CONSTRUCTION TECHNOLOGY increased 185% from 13 to 37, although this represents only partial recovery from a much sharper decline in enrollments from the reporting cycle. Primarily as an outcome of expanded program offerings, enrollments in HEALTH SCIENCES increased 600% from 2 to 14, enrollments in ENGLISH increased 225% from 8 to 26, and enrollments in HISTORY increased 100% from 13 to 26. A number of much larger program areas, notably FIRE SCIENCE TECHNOLOGY, BUSINESS, AND PSYCHOLOGY, saw smaller proportional gains ranging from 10.5% to 47.7%, but in absolute enrollments account for several hundred more students compared to the smaller programs that achieved much stronger proportional increases, and in many ways more accurately reflect areas of growth at the college.

Q1Q19 - GENERAL NOTE As elaborated in Palo Verde's recent reaffirmation activities, the college is in the process of rebooting its institutional research and reporting protocols. Although the general trends should remain consistent, the absolute values disclosed in this annual report will likely vary in some ways from previous years as researchers refine data sourcing and extraction, and otherwise improve reporting fidelity.

COMMENT Q5 Palo Verde follows a fall-leading, summer-lagging academic calendar.

COMMENT Q10 Palo Verde is improving capacity to directly query its SIS, but relies on external sources for outcomes like exit-transfer and employment.

COMMENT Q12 For purposes of this reporting, Palo Verde College is reporting credit-bearing courses using traditional graded (A, B, C, etc.) or Pass/No Pass outcome denominations for active sections with census-enrolled students.

COMMENT Q16 Exit transfer estimates are sourced from the UC and CSU system, and supplemented by limited CCC reporting. Moving forward, the college is seeking to integrate NSCH Student Tracker outcomes into its reporting stream to improve precision of exit-transfer reporting.
